## Advent: Hope

Tell of a time when you had to motivate your kids with a promise? Example: "You can have some ice cream, after you clean your room."

Why do you think a PROMISE is so motivational?

Our passage for this week was Colossians 1:24-29, focusing on the implications of the phrase "Christ in you, the hope of glory." However, this passage is built on the preceding context of verses 21-23.

## READ: Colossians 1:21-23

In other words, how is the "hope of glory" evidenced by "Christ in you"?
